From South Broad Street (US-206) turn west onto West Park Ave. Turn left onto Westcott Avenue and then right at the green sign into Roebing Park. Parking lot is located on the right near the Watson House just before the road descends downhill. Nature Center is readily visible by the large white gazebo in front of its main entrance.

The Tulpehaking Nature Center is the main gateway to the Abbott Marshlands, a rich natural oasis just three miles south of Trenton, NJ.
